COMPLAINT FOR INJUNCTIVE AND
OTHER RELIEF UNDER THE
SERVICE MEMBERS' CIVIL RELIEF
ACT, RCW 38.42, AND THE
CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT,
RCW 19.86

The Plaintiff, State of Washington, by and through its attorneys Robert W. Ferguson, Attorney General, and John A. Nelson, Assistant Attorney General, brings this action against the Defendants named below for violations of the Washington Service Members' Civil Relief Act, RCW 38.42, and the Washington Consumer Protection Act, RCW 19.86. The State alleges the following on information and belief:

I. INTRODUCTION

1.1. Washington State serves as a major Department of Defense power projection platform and supports Army, Navy, Air Force, and Coast Guard installations within its borders. Pierce County and its neighboring counties are home to thousands of active duty

1 servicemembers, and Joint Base Lewis-McChord alone represents the largest employer in the
2 county, and the third largest employer in the State.¹

3 1.2. Washington servicemembers who are called to active duty have important legal
4 protections under the Washington State Service Members' Civil Relief Act (WSCRA),
5 RCW 38.42, and its federal analogue, the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act (SCRA), 50 U.S.C.
6 §§ 3901-4043. As the United States Supreme Court explained 75 years ago, the purpose of these
7 types of laws is to "protect those who have been obliged to drop their own affairs to take up the
8 burdens of the nation." *Boone v. Lightner*, 319 U.S. 561, 575 (1943). In a 2014 amendment to
9 the WSCRA, the Washington Legislature changed the WSCRA to make violations of the federal
10 SCRA violations of State law. It also granted the Washington Attorney General authority to
11 investigate and prosecute violations of the WSCRA.

12 1.3. One of the many legal protections afforded under the SCRA is the requirement that
13 a person or entity holding a lien on the property or effects of an active duty servicemember—
14 including a towing company holding a storage lien against a motor vehicle — must obtain a court
15 order prior to enforcing the lien and selling a motor vehicle at auction.

16 1.4. Determining whether the registered owner of a vehicle is an active duty
17 servicemember is a straightforward process. The United States Department of Defense operates
18 an online database where, using an individual's date of birth and/or Social Security number, any
19 person or business can verify military status instantly, and for no cost.² The photo below captures
20 this process.

14 1.5. In the event that a person or entity seeking to enforce a lien does not have a Social
15 Security number or date of birth, it may attempt to obtain an individual's military status for a fee
16 by using a private database or service to learn this information.³

17 1.6. If, after using the Department of Defense database or another service, a towing
18 company learns that the registered owner of a vehicle is an active duty servicemember, under
19 the SCRA, it must obtain a court order before it sells an impounded vehicle at auction.

20 1.7. As noted above, there are important reasons for this special protection. Among
21 others, because active duty servicemembers often serve in distant, remote locations where
22 receiving mail may be difficult, if not impossible, a servicemember may not receive prompt
23 notification that his or her vehicle is impounded and scheduled to be sold. To address this, prior

1 to issuing an order allowing for the sale of a servicemember's vehicle, a court could stay the
2 proceedings until a servicemember returns from deployment or is otherwise able to appear.

3 1.8. However, despite a large military presence within Pierce County—and the
4 increased possibility that a towed vehicle may be owned by an active duty servicemember—
5 upon information and belief, prior to enforcing storage liens under RCW 46.55, Tacoma towing
6 operator Burns Towing, Inc. regularly fails to (1) determine whether the registered owner of a
7 motor vehicle is an active duty servicemember, and (2) obtain a court order prior to enforcing a
8 lien.

9 1.9. In one recent instance occurring in April, without first obtaining a court order,
10 Burns Towing impounded, and later sold a motor vehicle owned by a Naval Petty Officer who
11 was deployed at sea on the U.S.S. John C. Stennis. Shockingly, after being contacted by both a
12 Navy Legal Assistance Attorney representing the Petty Officer whose car was sold at auction,
13 and the Attorney General's Office (after the servicemember submitted a complaint to the State),
14 Burns Towing failed to properly account for its violation of the law by making the
15 servicemember whole for the loss of his vehicle.

16 1.10. By failing to obtain court orders before auctioning, selling, or otherwise disposing
17 of the motor vehicles and personal effects of protected servicemembers, Burns Towing prevents
18 servicemembers from obtaining a court's review—a protection afforded to servicemembers
19 under the law—to determine whether the lien sale should be delayed or adjusted to account for
20 their military service.

21 II. PARTIES

22 2.1. The Plaintiff is the State of Washington (State). The Attorney General is
23 authorized to commence this action pursuant to RCW 38.42.140 and RCW 19.86.080.

24 2.2. Defendant Burns Towing, Inc. (Burns) is a Washington corporation whose
25 principal place of business is located at 6454 McKinley Ave. East, Tacoma, Washington 98404.
26

1 In addition to its McKinley Ave. location, Burns conducts towing operations at an additional
2 location in Lakewood, and operates an abandoned auto auction facility in Tacoma.

3 2.3. Defendant Kristine A. Zachary (Zachary) is president and owner of Burns. At all
4 times relevant to this lawsuit, Zachary was in charge of day-to-day operations of Burns. Upon
5 information and belief, Zachary controlled and supervised the acts, practices, and omissions of
6 Burns which give rise to this action. Zachary is sued both in her individual capacity and in her
7 capacity as president and owner of Burns.

8 2.4. Defendants Burns Towing, Inc. (Burns), and Kristine A. Zachary (Zachary) are
9 collectively referred to as "Defendants."

10 III. JURISDICTION AND VENUE

11 3.1 The State files this complaint and institutes these proceedings under the
12 provisions of the Service Members' Civil Relief Act, RCW 38.42, and the Consumer Protection
13 Act, RCW 19.86.

14 3.2 Burns has engaged in the conduct set forth in this complaint in Pierce County by
15 towing vehicles, impounding vehicles, and selling vehicles in Tacoma and other cities within the
16 County.

17 3.3 Venue is proper in Pierce County pursuant to RCW 4.12.020 and 4.12.025
18 because Burns transacts business in Pierce County, and provides consumers with an address in
19 Pierce County.

20 IV. NATURE OF TRADE OR COMMERCE

21 4.1 Burns, at all times relevant to this action, has been engaged in trade or commerce
22 within the meaning of RCW 19.86.020, by operating towing and roadside assistance services to
23 Washington consumers.

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V. FACTS

A. Burns Towing

5.1 As a full service towing company, Burns operates a large fleet of tow trucks within Pierce County, Washington, and provides towing and other roadside assistance. It advertises its services multiple ways, including on its website, <https://www.burnstowing.com>, and via Facebook, <https://www.facebook.com/BurnsTowing/>.

5.2 Upon information and belief, Burns has towing contracts with multiple Pierce County property owners, including many large apartment communities. These contracts allow Burns to tow and impound motor vehicles at the request of a respective property owner.

5.3 Upon information and belief, Burns is also one of the towing companies with whom the Tacoma Police Department contracts for the towing and storage of abandoned or disabled motor vehicles.

B. Burns' Storage and Sale of Impounded Vehicles

5.4 After an abandoned motor vehicle is taken into custody by Burns, in accordance with RCW 46.55.110, it sends a written notice of abandoned vehicle by registered or certified mail to the person(s) identified as the registered owner(s) in the Department of Licensing database. After receiving notice of the impound, a registered owner may recover his or her vehicle by paying all outstanding towing and storage fees.

5.5 Under RCW 46.55.130, if a motor vehicle is not reclaimed by the owner within 15 days of the date the notice was mailed, the vehicle can be disposed of by public auction after a public advertisement. Any amount realized by Burns at auction is applied to outstanding towing and storage fees.

5.6 Impounded vehicle auctions are a significant part of Burns' business. The company owns and operates a vehicle auction facility located at 7401 McKinley Ave. in Tacoma, Washington. On a monthly basis, Burns conducts large-scale vehicle auctions. For example, an

1 announcement regarding a September 11, 2018, auction, attached as **Exhibit 1** to this Complaint,
2 lists 55 vehicles to be sold.

3 5.7 However, despite impounding and selling hundreds of vehicles a year, based upon
4 information and belief, prior to selling vehicles at auction, Burns fails to search the free,
5 publically-available Department of Defense online database,
6 <https://scra.dmdc.osd.mil/scra/#/single-record>, to determine whether the respective registered
7 owners are active duty servicemembers. Based upon information and belief, Burns also fails to
8 verify the military status of a registered owner using a private service or database. Thus, given
9 Pierce County's large active duty servicemember population, every time Burns sells a motor
10 vehicle at auction, there is a risk that the registered owner may be an active duty servicemember.

11 **C. The Unlawful Sale of Petty Officer Second Class Alex Vaughn's Chevrolet Malibu**

12 5.8 Alex Vaughn is a Petty Officer Second Class (PO2) in the United States Navy.
13 At all times relevant to this action, PO2 Vaughn was an active duty servicemember.

14 5.9 At all times relevant to this lawsuit, PO2 Vaughn's motor vehicle was registered
15 in Washington.

16 5.10 From March 2018 through May 2018, PO2 Vaughn was deployed at sea. While
17 PO2 Vaughn was deployed at sea, on April 18, 2018, Burns towed and impounded PO2
18 Vaughn's 2011 Chevrolet Malibu, which was parked in Tacoma, Washington.

19 5.11 After impounding the Chevrolet Malibu, Burns sent a "custody and sale notice"—
20 which was returned as unclaimed—to the Bremerton, Washington, address at which PO2
21 Vaughn had registered his motor vehicle. Burns sent another certified letter to Navy Federal
22 Credit Union, the lien holder and legal owner of the motor vehicle.

23 5.12 When no party redeemed PO2 Vaughn's vehicle, Burns unlawfully sold the car
24 without making any effort to determine the military status of the registered owner, and without
25 obtaining a court order from a Pierce County court.

1 **D. When Confronted About its Unlawful Sale, Burns Failed To Help PO2 Vaughn**

2 5.13 This Complaint is not the first time Burns was notified of its unlawful actions. On
3 two separate occasions, Burns was notified that its sale of PO2 Vaughn's vehicle was unlawful—
4 first when his Navy Legal Assistance Attorney contacted it via a letter (*see Exhibit 2* attached
5 hereto), and second when the Attorney General sent a letter to Burns after receiving a complaint
6 from the servicemember.

7 5.14 In the first instance, Burns ignored PO2 Vaughn's attorney. In the second
8 instance, Defendant Kristine Zachary personally responded to the Attorney General, but in her
9 email, denied wrongdoing. Instead, Zachary blamed both the servicemember and Navy Federal
10 Credit Union, explaining in part, *"We have no record of any notification that the [PO2 Vaughn]
11 was in the military service at the time... At any time the legal owner (Navy Federal Credit
12 Union) had the opportunity to redeem the vehicle, however they chose not to."* (emphasis
13 added). A copy of Burn's response is attached to this Complaint as **Exhibit 3**.

14 5.15 Burns' response to the Attorney General is important for two reasons. First, it is
15 the person who is seeking to enforce a storage lien who has the obligation to determine whether
16 the registered owner of a vehicle is on active duty, *not* the servicemember. Such a statement
17 clearly demonstrates Burns' lack of awareness regarding important laws protecting Washington
18 servicemembers. Second, in its response, Burns blames Navy Federal Credit Union (whose
19 stated vision is to "be the most preferred and trusted financial institution serving the military and
20 their families") for failing to redeem the vehicle.⁴ But based on the name of the lender alone,
21 Burns should have known that there was a high likelihood that the vehicle had been financed by
22 an active duty servicemember.

1 **VI. FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION**

2 **(VIOLATIONS OF THE SERVICE MEMBERS' CIVIL RELIEF ACT, RCW 38.42)**

3 6.1 Plaintiff re-alleges Paragraphs 1.1 through 5.15 and incorporates them as if fully
4 set forth herein.

5 6.2 Defendants have unlawfully enforced liens on the property or effects of active
6 duty servicemembers by selling impounded motor vehicles at auction without authorizing court
7 orders, in violation of 50 U.S.C. § 3958.

8 6.3 Violations of the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act, 50 U.S.C. § 3901-4043,
9 constitute violations of State law. *See* RCW 38.42.120.

10 6.4 Protecting deployed servicemembers from the execution of illegal storage liens
11 is an issue of significant public importance under RCW 38.42.140.

12 **VII. SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION**

13 **(VIOLATIONS OF THE CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT, RCW 19.86)**

14 7.1 Plaintiff re-alleges Paragraphs 1.1 through 6.4 and incorporates them as if fully
15 set forth herein.

16 7.2 Defendants engage in unfair and deceptive acts or practices within the meaning
17 of RCW 19.86.020 by failing to use either the Department of Defense database or a private
18 service to verify the military status, if any, of the registered owners of motor vehicles impounded
19 and sold by them.

20 7.3 Defendants' business practices have the capacity to deceive a substantial number
21 of consumers, including Washington active duty servicemembers, because (1) Pierce County is
22 home to thousands of servicemembers, the vast majority of whom own and operate motor
23 vehicles, and (2) Defendants tow, impound, and sell at auction, hundreds of motor vehicles each
24 year.

25 7.4 Defendants' actions affect the public interest because, based upon information
26 and belief, they repeatedly engaged in the conduct described above over a multi-year period.

1 7.5 Defendants' business practices are not reasonable in relation to the development
2 and preservation of business.

3 **VIII. PRAYER FOR RELIEF**

4 WHEREFORE, Plaintiff, STATE OF WASHINGTON, prays that this Court grant the
5 following relief:

6 8.1 That the Court adjudge and decree that the Defendants have engaged in the
7 conduct complained of herein.

8 8.2 That the Court adjudge and decree that Defendants' failure to verify the military
9 status of a motor vehicle's registered owner prior to enforcing a storage lien constitutes an unfair
10 or deceptive act or practice and an unfair method of competition and is unlawful in violation of
11 the Consumer Protection Act, Chapter 19.86 RCW.

12 8.3 That the Court adjudge and decree that Defendants' practice of failing to obtain
13 court orders when enforcing storage liens on active duty servicemembers is unlawful in violation
14 of the Service Members' Civil Relief Act, Chapter 38.42 RCW.

15 8.4 That the Court issue a permanent injunction enjoining and restraining Defendants
16 and their representatives, successors, assigns, officers, agents, servants, employees, and all other
17 persons acting or claiming to act for, on behalf of, or in active concert or participation with
18 Defendants, from continuing or engaging in the unlawful conduct complained of herein.

19 8.5 That the Court assess civil penalties, pursuant to RCW 19.86.140, of up to two
20 thousand dollars (\$2,000) per violation against the Defendants for each and every violation of
21 RCW 19.86.020 caused by the conduct complained of herein.

22 8.6 That the Court assess civil penalties against Defendants, pursuant to
23 RCW 38.42.140, of up to fifty-five thousand dollars (\$55,000) for the first violation of
24 RCW 38.42.120, and in an amount not exceeding one hundred ten thousand dollars (\$110,000)
25 for any subsequent violations of RCW 38.42.120 caused by the conduct complained of herein.

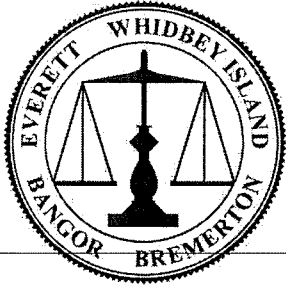

Dear Burns Towing,

I am assisting Petty Officer Second Class Alex Vaughn, U.S. Navy, in my capacity as a legal assistance attorney.

Please be advised that Petty Officer Vaughn is currently on active duty with the U.S. Navy and has been on active duty since December 10, 2012. I have enclosed a copy of the Department of Defense Manpower Data Center Certificate proving Petty Officer Vaughn's active duty status. During the months of March, April, and May, Petty Officer Vaughn was deployed with his command.

Also enclosed, is the Lien and Title Information Report for Petty Officer Vaughn's vehicle. This shows that Navy Federal Credit Union still holds a lien on his vehicle. Therefore, any sale of a storage lien on the vehicle would be invalid.

As I am sure you are aware, the Service Member's Civil Relief Act, 50 U.S. Code § 3958, prevents sale of a storage lien of an active duty service member. The violation of this section may result in a fine or confinement for not more than one year, or both as seen in the enclosed press release with regard to the U.S. Department of Justice's recent settlement agreement with a towing company.

I would like to start this email off with my apologies for not responding sooner and also the comment that Mr. Vaughn has never contacted this office for an explanation of the impound and auctioning of his vehicle.

The situation with this vehicle is a bit long, however I will do my best to keep this reply as brief, yet thorough as possible.

The vehicle was impounded on 4/18/18 by the Tacoma Police Department. We then sent out a 24 hour notice to Mr. Vaughn as required by RCW 45.55 as well as Navy Federal Credit Union, who was the legal owner of the vehicle. Both 24 hour notices were returned. After 5 days the vehicle is considered abandoned and at that point we sent out our "custody and sale notice" to both Mr. Vaughn and Navy Federal credit union by Certificate of Mailing. Mr. Vaughn's was returned but Navy Federal Credit Union was not. We have no record of any notification that the R/O was in the military service at the time. The vehicle was abandoned in Tacoma Washington and was registered with a Bremerton Washington address. At any time the legal owner (Navy Federal Credit Union) had the opportunity to redeem the vehicle, however they chose not to. Mr. Vaughn states that the vehicle was sold at auction shortly after his return, which shows that he was no longer deployed at the time that the vehicle was auctioned off.

I have attached a copy of the Certificate of Mailing to show that we did our due diligence to contact both the R/O and L/O.
